

Instructions for Presentations

Please read this section carefully!

The presentations will be selected by the co-chairs of each session and therefore it is essential that they are submitted before the deadline of **15 April 2022**. *Presentations received after this deadline will not be taken into consideration*. You may receive instructions on how to optimize your pitch during the review process - please follow them promptly, as only final presentations can be accepted.

You will receive an email not later than **25 April**, confirming that you have been selected to present your submitted final pitch presentation.

For presentation of a proposal for a specific topic in the work programme:

As indicated in the template, all presentations should give a short summary of contributions or ideas for a new project proposal. Please carefully select your contribution(s) bearing in mind the limited time of 4 minutes available for your talk. Presenting potential consortia must be open for entry from other participants. Priority will be given to presentations by potential coordinators.

Instructions:

- The presentation must be submitted on using the SMI2G template (download the template from the registration page), and should not be longer than 3-4 slides.
- You will have maximum of 4 minutes to present the proposal.
- Name your file in reference for the topic which the presentation refers to, followed by the name of the participant who will present it (e.g. CL3-FCT-01-04_YOURNAME)
- We recommend you present the status of your consortium and what capabilities (or type of partners) you seek.
- You should not give a company description or address multiple topics. If you have proposals for several topics, you must register and submit a presentation for each.
