EIC MAIN INSTRUMENTS

PATHFINDER – from early stages of a technology to a proof of concept (TRL 1 - 3/4)

TRANSITION – from a proof of concept to a pre-commercial stage (TRL 3/4 – 5/6)

ACCELERATOR – from a pre-commercial stage to the market uptake and scale-up (TRL 5 – 9)



- EIC calls are mostly Open ("bottom-up")
- > Specific thematic calls are called **Challenges**

WHAT DOES EIC PATHFINDER SUPPORT



- Research of new directions in science and technology
- High-risk approach with the aim to bring breakthrough technological solutions and create market opportunities
- Interdisciplinary projects combining different perspectives in order to open up new technological pathways
- Projects with a high potential to have a positive effect on the society and economy

WHAT PROJECTS ARE NOT SUPPORTED



> Projects focused purely on pushing boundaries of a scientific field with no potential/ambition to develop a new technology/innovation

Projects focused on an incremental development or development of already known methods/principles



WHAT IS EXPECTED?

- Expected output
 - Proof of principle that the main ideas of the envisioned future technology are feasible
- Important aspect of project proposals
 - > Top-level scientific publications
 - Adequate formal protection of the generated Intellectual Property
 - Assessment of relevant aspects related to regulation, certification, and standardization
 - Empowerment of excellent early career researchers or promising high-tech SMEs
 - > Gender balance among the WP leaders





WHY CHALLENGES?

- The objective of EIC Pathfinder is to speed up development of new technologies that will reinforce the EU strategic autonomy and global competitiveness
- Challenges help to direct efforts into selected strategic areas
- The areas are defined based on industry needs, the EU strategies and an analysis of funded Horizon projects
- EIC Programme Managers play an important role in Challenges design and execution



EIC PROGRAMME MANAGERS

- Experts in strategic areas with academic as well as business backgrounds
- Identify potential challenges for emerging technologies and disruptive innovations
- They take part in the project selection process and steer selected projects portfolios towards the Challenge objectives

EIC PATHFINDER CHALLENGES 2024

- Solar-to-X devices for the decentralized prosumption of renewable fuels, chemicals and materials as climate change mitigation pathway
- Towards cement and concrete as a carbon sink
- Nature inspired alternatives for food packaging and films for agriculture
- Nanoelectronics for energy-efficient smart edge devices
- Strengthening the sustainability and resilience of EU space infrastructure





EIC PATHFINDER CHALLENGES CALL 2024

- Planned opening: June 20, 2024
- Deadline: October 16, 2024
- EU contribution up to EUR 4 million (lump sum)
 - The overal call budget is EUR 120 mio
- RIA (100 % eligible costs)
- Individual or Collaborative research:
 - > Single legal entity (companies larger than SMEs are not allowed to apply as a single entity)
 - ➤ A consortium of 2 partners from 2 different MS/AC
 - > A consortium of at least 3 partners from 3 different MS/AC (standard HE rules)

PORTFOLIO CONSIDERATIONS

Projects in a portfolio are supposed to be complementary



Interaction among projects is expected

- Challenge Guide = key document for the applicants
 - > It specifies the aspects to be taken into account when establishing a project portfolio

WHAT ARE PATHFINDER BENEFICIARIES ELIGIBLE FOR

- EIC Booster grant
 - Additional grant of up to EUR 150K to undertake complementary activities to explore potential pathways to commercialisation or for portfolio activities
- EIC Transition scheme
- Fast Track to the EIC Accelerator
- Next Generation Innovation Talents scheme
- Business Acceleration Services



SUPPORT TO APPLICANTS FROM THE WIDERA INTERNATIONAL NETWORK

- Free expert pre-check of the proposal
- For proposals with a coordinator or a WP leader from a widening country

SOME FAQS


- What is the expected duration of a Pathfinder project?
 - > There is no pre-defined duration, the projects typically last between 36 and 60 months
- Is there any expected/recommended size of a consortium, does the size correlate with chances to succeed?
 - No, the success depends on the quality of the proposal and ability of the applicant to implement the project
- Is it obligatory to include industry partners into the consortium?
 - No, it is not obligatory. It may however be beneficial for the future commercialization activities or be taken into account during the evaluation
